Screening of the documentary film "Salam Neighbor" www.livingonone.org/salamneighbor/, English with Slovak subtitles) and a video message from the directors Chris Temple and Zach Ingrasci. As the first filmmakers they were allowed to live for a month inside a UNHCR refugee camp Za'atari in Jordan near Syrian borders. It is one of the biggest refugee camps in the world with currently more than 80 000 Syrian refugees.

Zach and Chris uncover inspiring stories of individuals rallying, against all odds, to rebuild their lives and those of their neighbours. The film follows a story of Um Ali, a woman struggling to overcome personal loss and cultural barriers, and the street smart boy Raouf, whose trauma hides just beneath his ever present smile. It won awards at several film festivals.

20.00 / Discussion with Kilian Kleinschmidt about the dire conditions which refugees face. Kilian is a former director of Za'atari refugee camp in Northern Jordan and has over 25 years of hand-on experience in humanitarian aid and work with refugees.
