LIVES IN DISPLACEMENT

Lack of access to basic needs.

Among the 1.5 million refugees in Lebanon, over 70% are considered below the poverty line and 55% below the "extreme" poverty line. Due to Covid-19 and the impact of the Beirut explosion, access to critical aid and protection services have become incredibly difficult.

Lack of access to work rights.

Labour laws in Lebanon restrict refugees from working in the majority of sectors, despite them often having high education credentials. This forces most to either depend on aid or enter the informal workforce, where they face exploitation - such as months without minimum pay - and abuse.

Uncertain futures.

Refugee children are among the

most vulnerable, with thousands in Lebanon out of school - either because they are not allowed to register and/or their families cannot afford to send them. They are the future of the region, but they are most at jeopardy of losing all opportunities for a decent life.

A NEW MOBILITY OPTION FOR REFUGEES.

Talent Beyond Boundaries envisions a world where forcibly displaced people can use their skills to move to secure futures.

- Canada: Economic Mobility Pathways Project 500 primary applicant places
- **United Kingdom**: Home Office pilot 100 places; Healthcare/nurses Pilot 200+ places















Talent Beyond Boundaries

Impact

- 266 refugees have secured a durable solution through our labour mobility program
- Salary: Range from \$33,600 USD to \$87,400 USD for candidates across different professions.
- Quality of life: Increased access to healthcare and education for children; increase in perceived safety, security and access to rights
- Flow on impacts: Over 60% sending remittance payments back to family in home and host countries
